

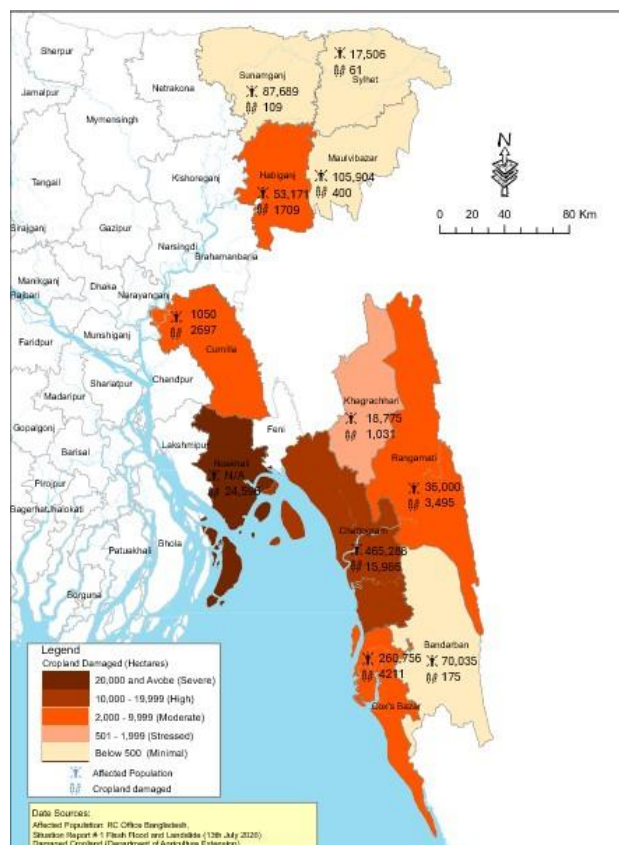

Key Highlights:

- Approximately 1.1 million people have been affected due to flooding situation and cascading hazards
- The Government has called for urgent humanitarian assistance in affected areas.
- An estimated 54,470 hectares of cropland and 324,358 farming households have been affected by heavy rainfall and cascading hazards
- The monetary value of losses caused by these shocks is estimated at **USD 23 Million** in the livestock and fisheries sectors alone.
- Preliminary reports from the Department of Fisheries (DoF) indicate that 7,613 MT of fish and prawns have been lost.
- A total of 266,038 livestock (cattle and buffalo), 173,592 goats and sheep, 2.85 million chickens, and 62,811 ducks have been affected. Reported animal deaths include 62 cattle, 139 goats, 59 sheep, 154,528 chickens, and 2,063 ducks.
- At least 38,422 people are staying in 1,047 formal evacuation shelters.

Situation Overview:

Since 5 July 2026, heavy rainfall driven by an active southwest monsoon and steep pressure gradients has triggered flash floods, waterlogging, and landslides across Chattogram, Sylhet, and upstream catchments. The disaster has damaged infrastructure, disrupted transport and communication, and affected food security and livelihoods.

As of 14 July 2026, 1.1 million people have been affected across 10 districts, with 56 fatalities reported. Crop damage reached 54,409 hectares, affecting 324,358 farming households. The livestock sector recorded impacts on 257,038 cattle, 173,592 goats and sheep, 2.85 million chickens, and 62,811 ducks. Total livestock sub-sector damage is estimated at BDT 576.2 million (USD 4.7 million). In addition, 21,764 fishponds and 784 commercial enclosures (8,966 ha) were washed away, causing an estimated loss of USD 18.3 million.

Priority Response Needs

- **Emergency ready-to-eat food:** Many flood- and landslide-affected households have been displaced or are unable to cook due to inundated homes, damaged kitchens, and disrupted access to markets. Immediate provision of ready-to-eat food is essential to meet urgent food needs during the emergency phase.
- **Livestock feed and shelter:** Flooding has submerged grazing areas and damaged livestock shelters, leaving animals without sufficient feed or safe shelter. Emergency livestock feed, temporary shelters, and veterinary support are needed to reduce livestock losses and protect household livelihoods.
- **Emergency agriculture support to safeguard food security:** Urgently restore damaged homestead gardens through the provision of climate-resilient seeds, essential inputs, and technical support to safeguard household food security, nutrition, and dietary diversity.
- **Storage for seeds, fertilizers, and agricultural inputs:** Floodwater has damaged or threatens to damage stored seeds, fertilizers, and other agricultural inputs ahead of the planting season. Waterproof storage containers and temporary storage facilities are needed to protect these inputs and support the rapid recovery of agricultural livelihoods.
- **Aquaculture & Fisheries Rehabilitation:** Provide urgent pond and commercial enclosures restoration, embankment repairs, and fingerling and feed restocking to rebuild damaged commercial aquaculture assets and immediately restart local fish production.
- **Multipurpose Cash Assistance:** Multipurpose cash transfers to the most affected farming, herding and fishing households to protect food consumption and prevent negative coping strategies.
- **Cooking fuel and utensils:** Many affected families have lost cooking utensils and fuel due to flooding or evacuation. The provision of cooking kits and clean cooking fuel is needed to enable households in shelters and flood-affected communities to safely prepare food once conditions allow.

Non-Government Response/Allocation:

- WFP emergency assistance is being provided to more than 211,000 people across flood-affected communities and Rohingya camps, while over 1 million people received early warning messages.³
- WFP has completed the immediate HEB response across Chattogram, Bandarban and Rangamati, delivering 122.75 MT of HEB to 24,550 households, approximately 122,750 people.
- Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) Allocated approximately 20 crore BDT in the districts of Chattogram, Cox's bazar, Rangamati, Bandarban, Khagrachhari, Moulvibazar, Habiganj, Sunamganj, Sylhet.
- Start Fund Bangladesh has allocated BDT 13.11 Crore in Six affected districts namely Chattogram, Cox's Bazar, Bandarban, Rangamati, Khagrachhari, and Moulvibazar.
- Islamic Relief Bangladesh (IRB) allocated GBP 150,000
- BRAC activated its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to coordinate the response and has distributed emergency dry food packages to 3,100 flood-affected families across five of the worst-affected districts in Chattogram Division. To further strengthen the response, BRAC allocated an additional BDT 3.3 million (33 lakh) to expand emergency food assistance in Chattogram, Rangamati, Cox's Bazar, and Bandarban.
- World Vision Bangladesh delivered 770 packet dry food distributed in Bandarban, food for 300 people at world vision shelter. In Cox's Bazar 500 HH with dry food.
- PROTTYASHI has been allocated BDT 1 crore in Chattogram region as a humanitarian response for the affected people.
