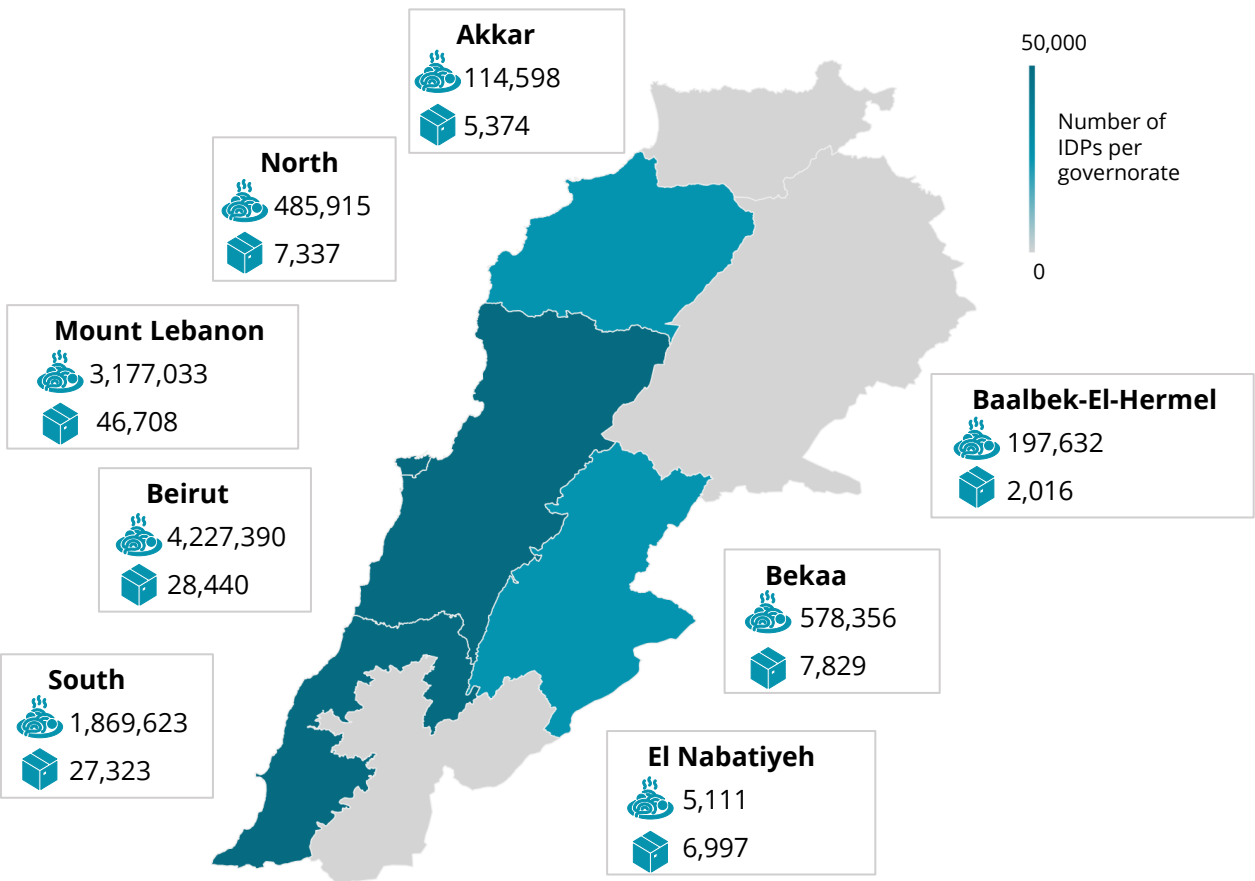

The map below shows the cumulative distribution of hot and cold meals, as well as ready-to-eat (RTE) food assistance, across the different governorates.



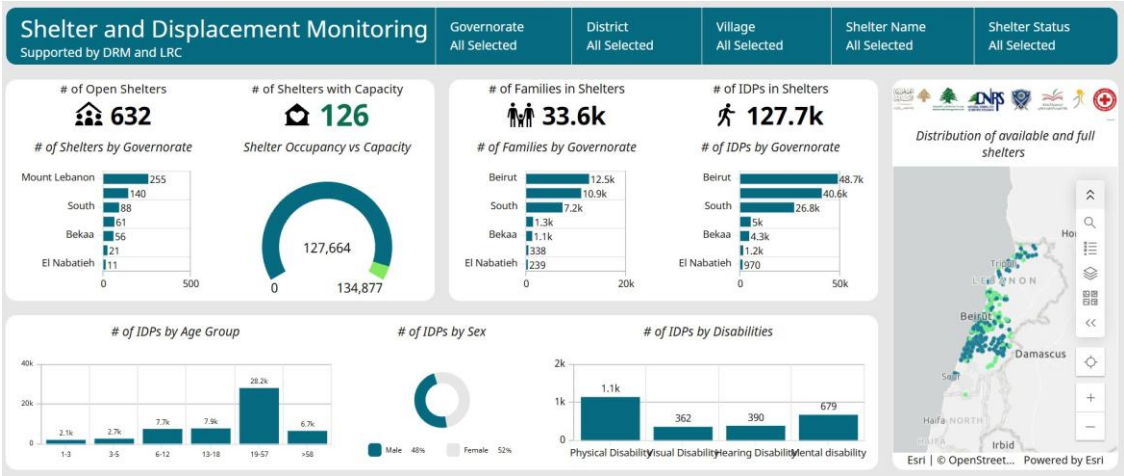

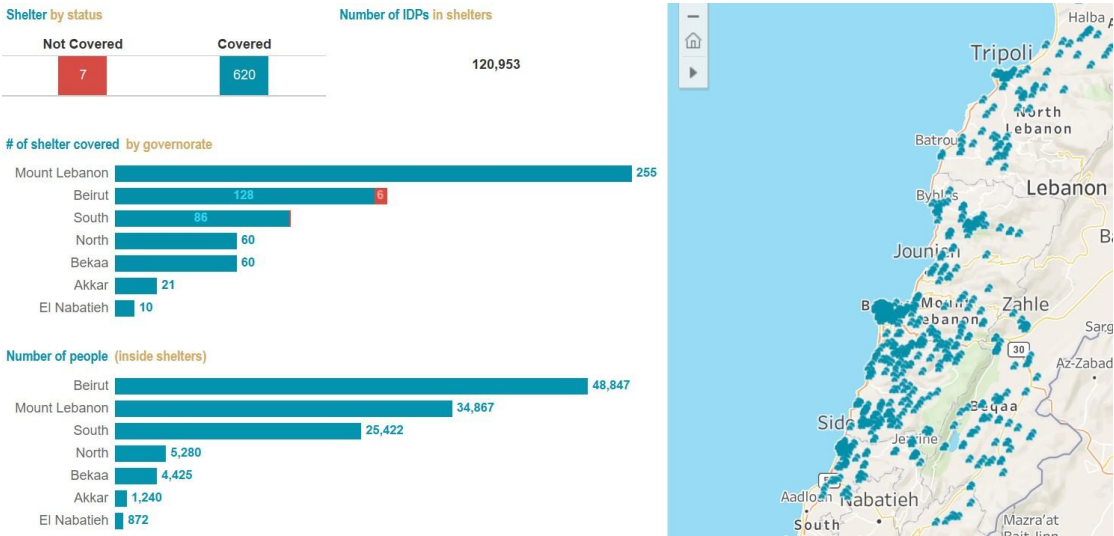
The ongoing escalation continues to result in loss of life, damage to housing, and increased displacement, as families move repeatedly in search of safety. More than one million people are currently displaced nationwide, including over 129,700 in collective shelters. According to the latest Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) projections, an estimated 1.24 million people are expected to face high levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above) between April and August 2026. This deterioration is driven by continued conflict and displacement, loss of livelihoods, disruptions to local markets in affected areas, rising food and fuel prices, and a projected decline in humanitarian food assistance coverage.

SHELTER RESPONSE OVERVIEW

The sector has developed a real-time dashboard to enhance coordination and monitoring of food assistance in collective shelters. It tracks partners' daily distributions, maps coverage by shelter, identifies gaps, and provides an overview of RTE kits, bakeries, and partner-supported kitchens linked to the shelters they serve.

Key Updates

- 1) A government-led initiative to produce and distribute bread through 22 bakeries across Lebanon was implemented by the Ministry of Economy and Trade, in coordination with the Disaster Risk Management Unit. The initiative is supported by Food Security and Agriculture Sector partners, who have begun integrating bread distribution into their existing ready-to-eat (RTE) and hot meal responses. The initiative is delivering around 11,000 packs of bread per day until the quantity is depleted.
- 2) WFP, in coordination with the FSA Sector and the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MEHE), has identified MEHE-owned public schools currently serving as collective shelters. Visits to ten schools are planned for this week to kick-off the operations for self-cooking in those shelters.
- 3) To support humanitarian access to hard-to-reach areas in south Lebanon, convoys that consist of food and lifesaving assistance were coordinated with WFP and the Logistics Cluster. Upcoming planned movements include a convoy to Tebnin and Tyre on 21 May, to Hasbaya on 22 May, to Fardis and Chebaa on 26 May, Zefta and Sarba on 28 May and Zrariye on 29 May.
- 4) The governor of Beirut has identified 24,000 family food parcels, while the governor of Mount Lebanon (Dahieh) has selected 30,000 vulnerable families . The sector supports assistance to people outside shelters, conditional on receipt of an official request with verified beneficiary figures. Eligible beneficiaries must not reside in shelters and must not be receiving SRSN cash assistance.
