

Food Security Situation in Mozambique – HNRP 2026 & Addendum

- Estimated 1.71 million people in need of urgent humanitarian assistance and protection in 2026 (Conflict: 977,110; Flooding response addendum: 733,518).
- Food insecurity in Mozambique remains a critical concern. According to the latest IPC Post-Shock Assessment released in September 2025, approximately 2.09 million people across assessed districts are currently facing high levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above), requiring urgent humanitarian assistance to safeguard lives and livelihoods. Among them, around 148,000 individuals are experiencing IPC Phase 4 (Emergency).
- For the projected period October 2025 to March 2026, an estimated 2.67 million people could face acute food insecurity, including 170,000 at risk of falling into IPC Phase 4.

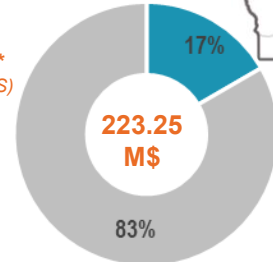

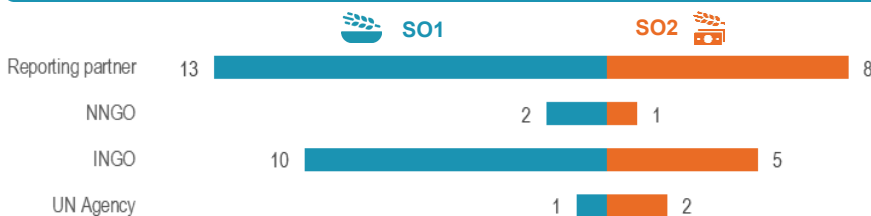

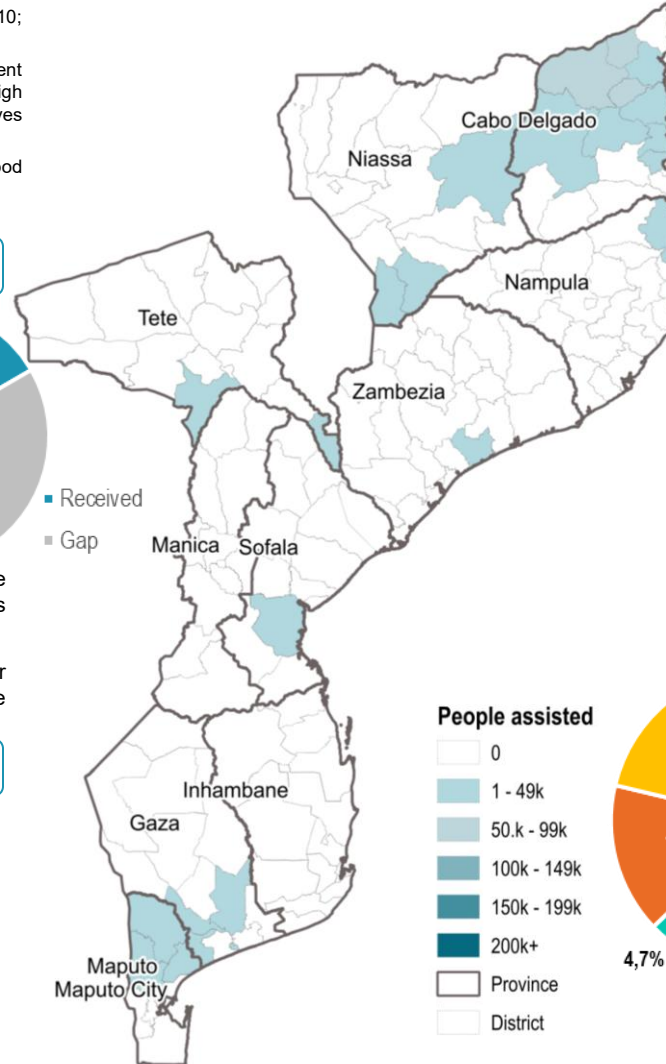

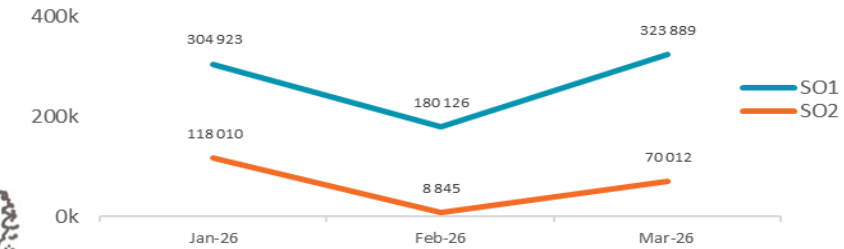
Reporting partner type by SO (January to March)



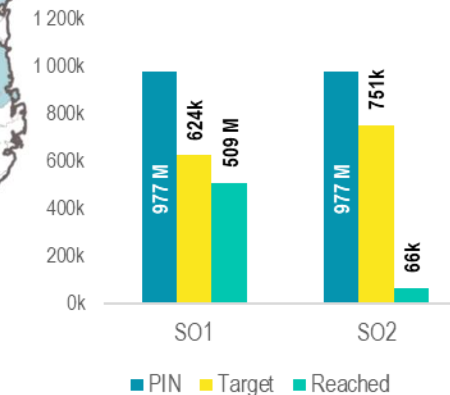

Monthly Response (HNRP, Addendum & Non-HRP) by SO



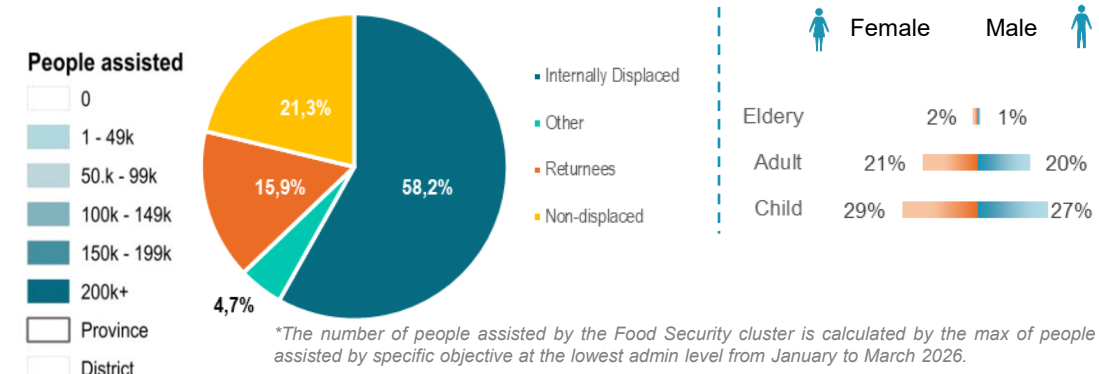
Response Gap by SO (HNRP)

Response by Population Type (all responses)

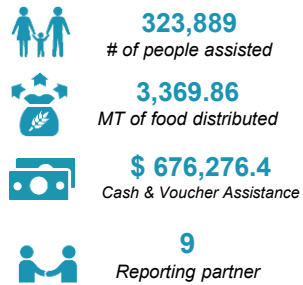

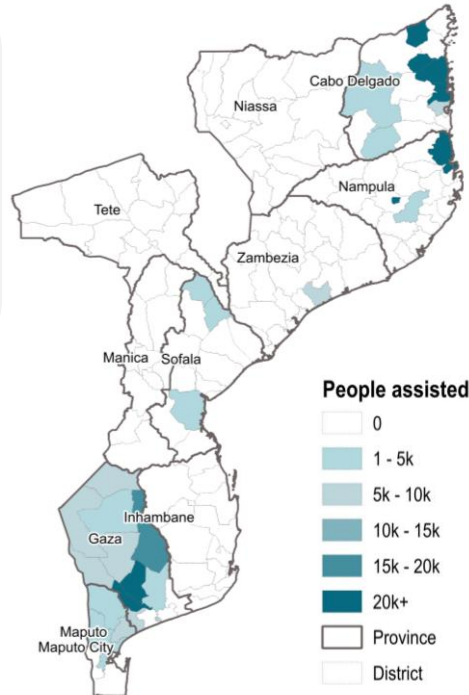
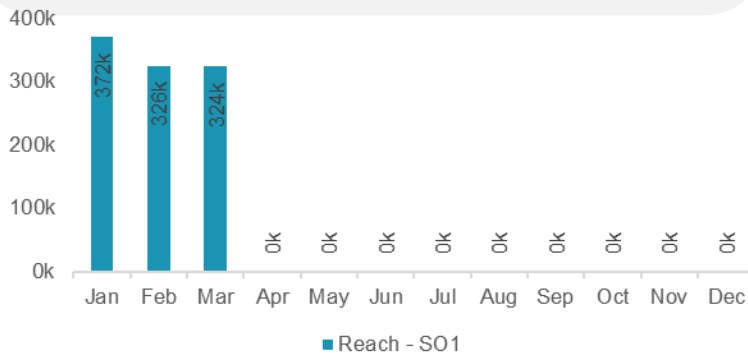
Breakdown by Activity

- 2- Provide monthly food assistance to acutely food insecure population through the most feasible and contextually appropriate modality



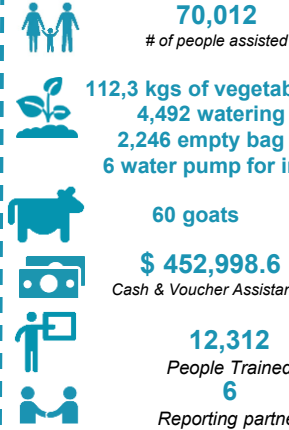
SO1 – March 2026

- In March 2026, nine partners provided General Food Distribution (GFD) assistance in response to both conflict-related needs in the north and the flooding emergency. These partners included ACF, ASeS, CEDES, ForAfrika, Iris Global, SCI, Tzu Chi Foundation, WFP, and World Vision Mozambique.
- A total of 264,240 beneficiaries were reached under the conflict response and 59,649 under the flood response. Overall, 90.28% of the assistance was provided in-kind, while 9.72% was delivered through Cash and Voucher Assistance (CVA).
- The composition of the GFD kit for conflict-affected populations was designed to cover at least 78% of the daily 2,100 kcal per person requirement for the targeted population. However, due to funding constraints, assistance has been provided in reduced cycles (one month of support covering two months of needs).



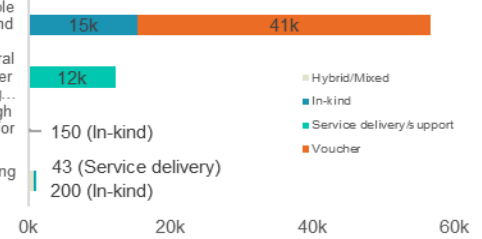

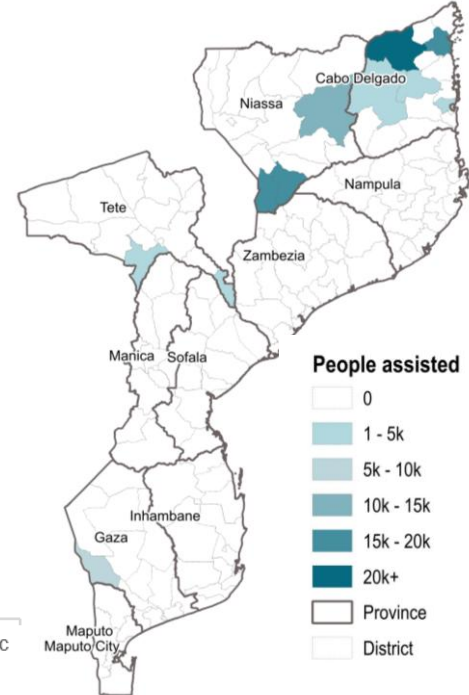
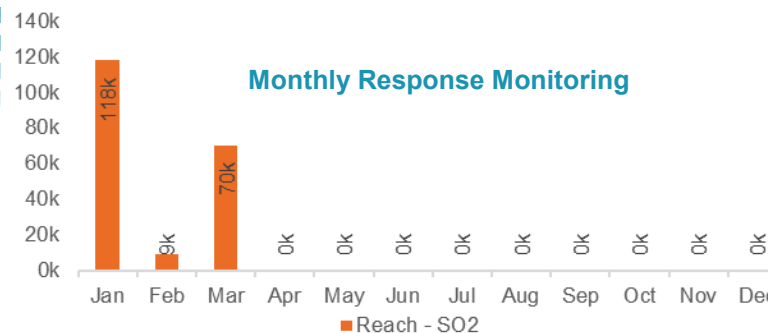
Response by activity

- 1- Distribution of agricultural inputs such as staple crop and vegetable seeds, fertilizer, pesticide and equipment, etc
- 2- Provide farmers with training in good agricultural practices (land preparation, sowing, soil and water management, etc), or any other related training...
- 3- Support to livestock production through provision of animals, feeds and training for diversification of diets and income
- 6- Support Income generating activities including vocational training



SO2 – March 2026

- In March 2026, six partners provided assistance with vegetables seeds, Watering cans, water pumps for irrigation schemes, livestock, empty bags for post harvest conservation.
- Partners: ACF, FAO, IDES, Save The Children International, Solidarités International (SI) and UNHCR.

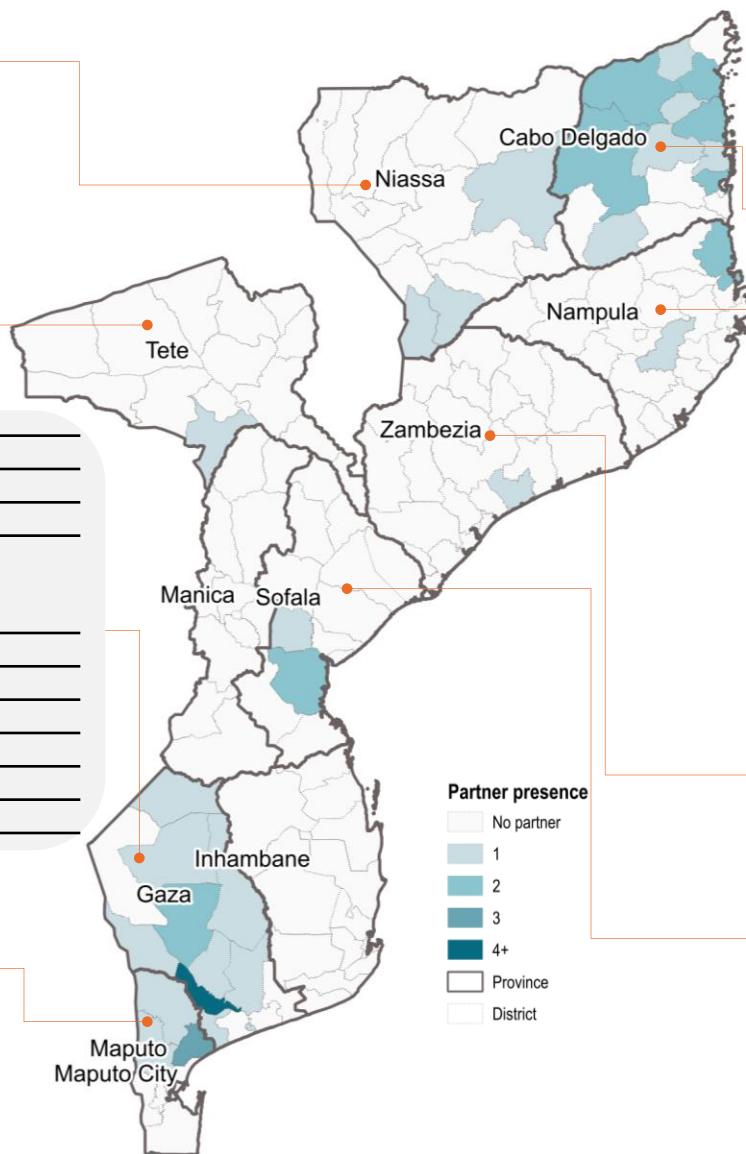

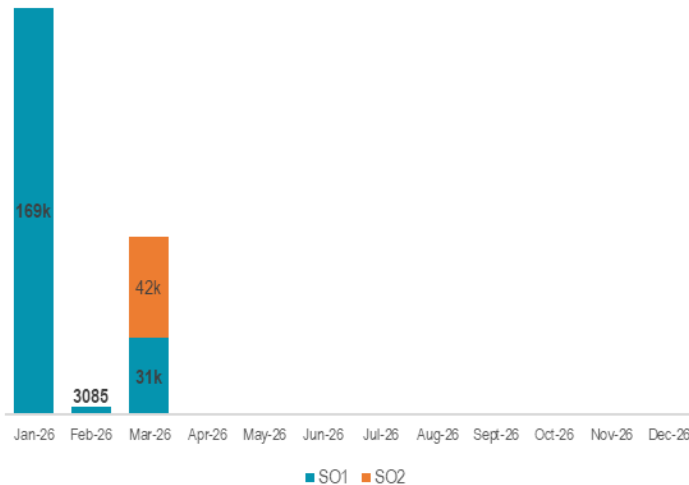

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Cash – March 2026

- Since the beginning of 2026, in total eight partners provided assistance in CVA, namely ACF, ADRA, Save The Children, World Food Programme and World Vision Mozambique for Food Assistance (SO1) and IDES, FAO and UNHCR for Agriculture and Livelihood (SO2).
- In total \$ 3,727,221 have been distributed where \$ 3,274,222 for SO1 and \$ 452,999 for SO2.
- The assistance was provided via cash and paper voucher.
- In total, four provinces have been covered in CVA assistance namely, Cabo Delgado, Nampula, Sofala and Gaza.

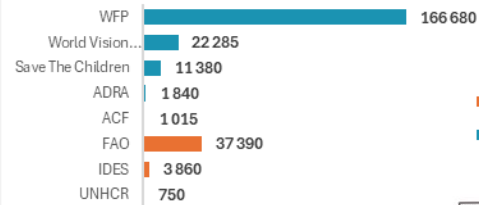
People assisted - monthly Response by SO



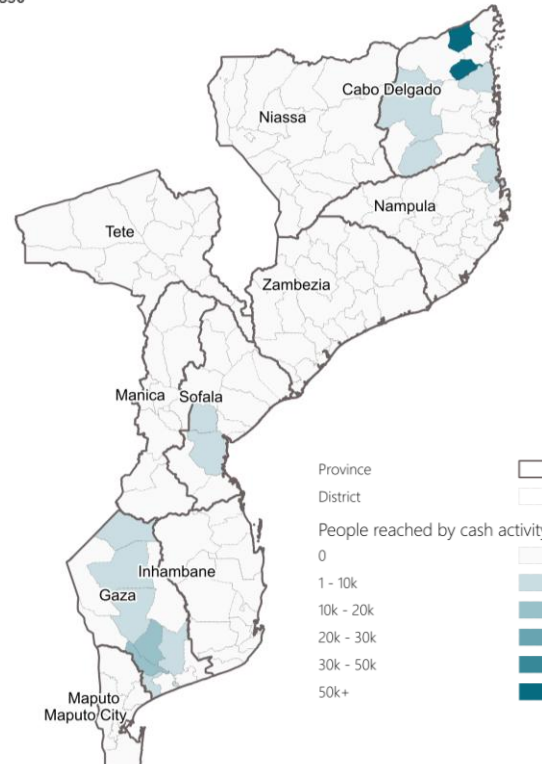

People Assisted per Partner and SO

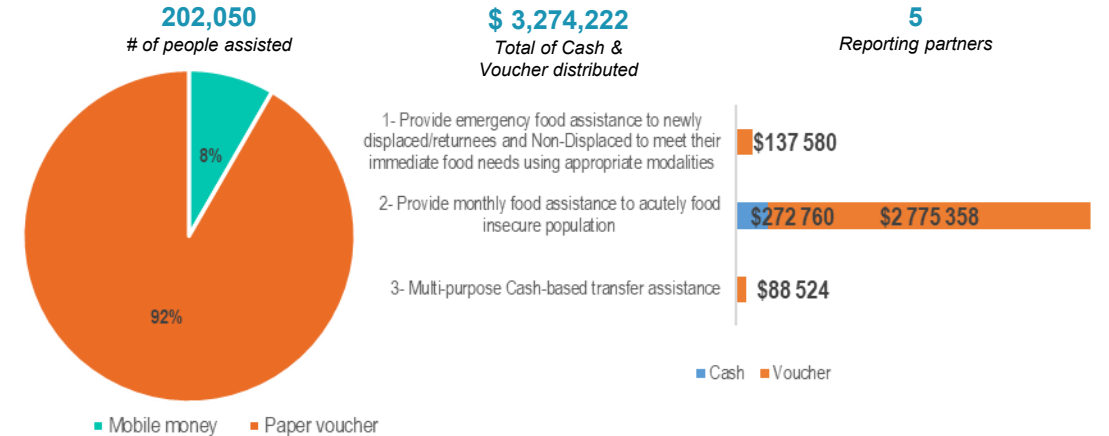

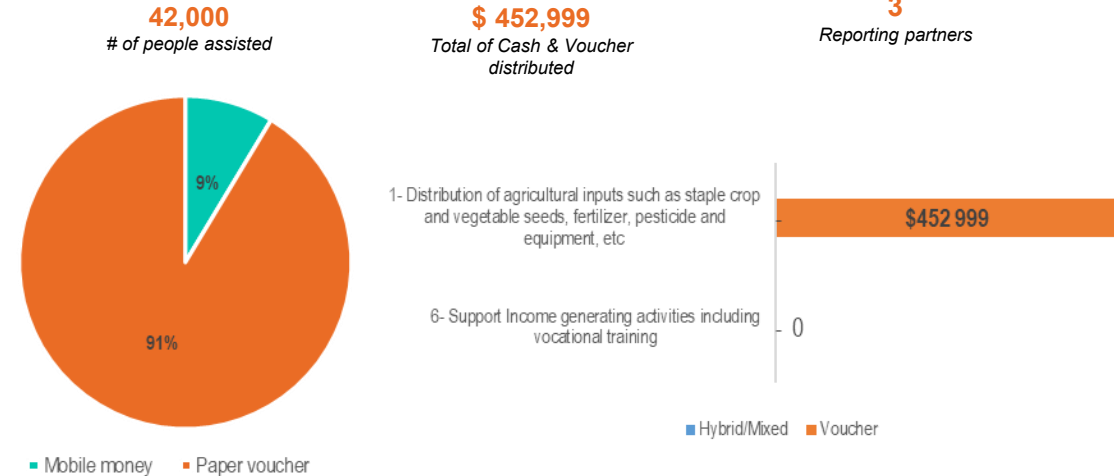

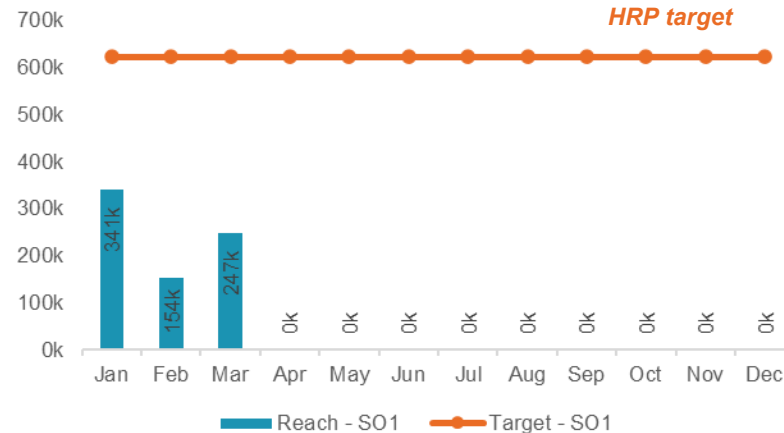
SO1 – March 2026

- For Food Assistance, in terms of people assisted (unique beneficiaries for at least one month), FSL partners have reached 81.56 % of the target.
- In terms of quantities distributed, FSL partners covered barely 5.60% of needs of the targeted people and only 12.94 % of the reached.
- Other 201,317 beneficiaries have been assisted in response to Flash Appeals for Floods, 20,010 conflict (Non-HNRP) and 21,780 under Social Protection.

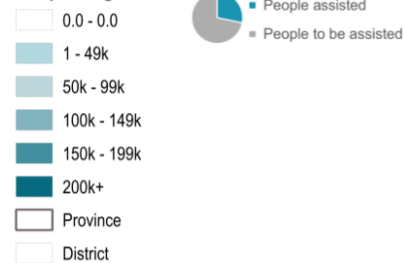
Gap Analysis Map – SO1

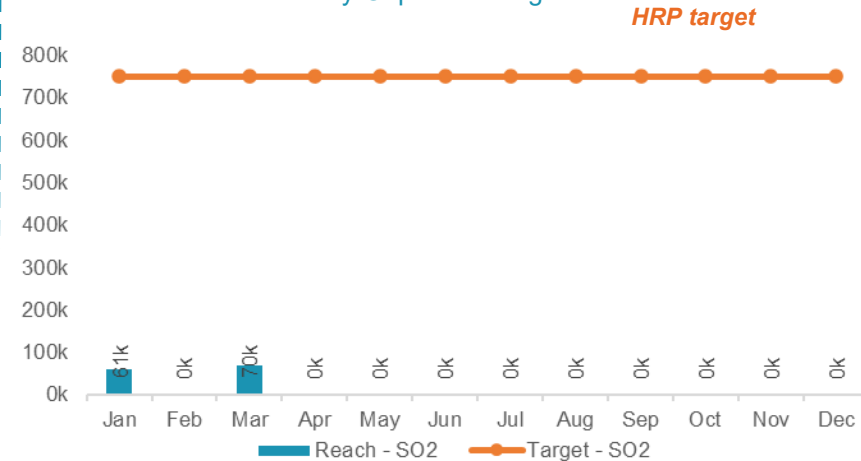
SO2 – March 2026

- The interventions in Agriculture & Livelihoods component is well below the target, reaching only 8.81% since the beginning of the year. Hope that with the fresh season the situation improve
- Other 118,958 beneficiaries have been assisted in response to other responses (Flash Appeals Floods – 46,070, residual of Drought – 47,727 and development – 5,375) receiving mostly agriculture inputs (seeds & tools, livestock, fisheries and post harvest storage bags) and trainings.
