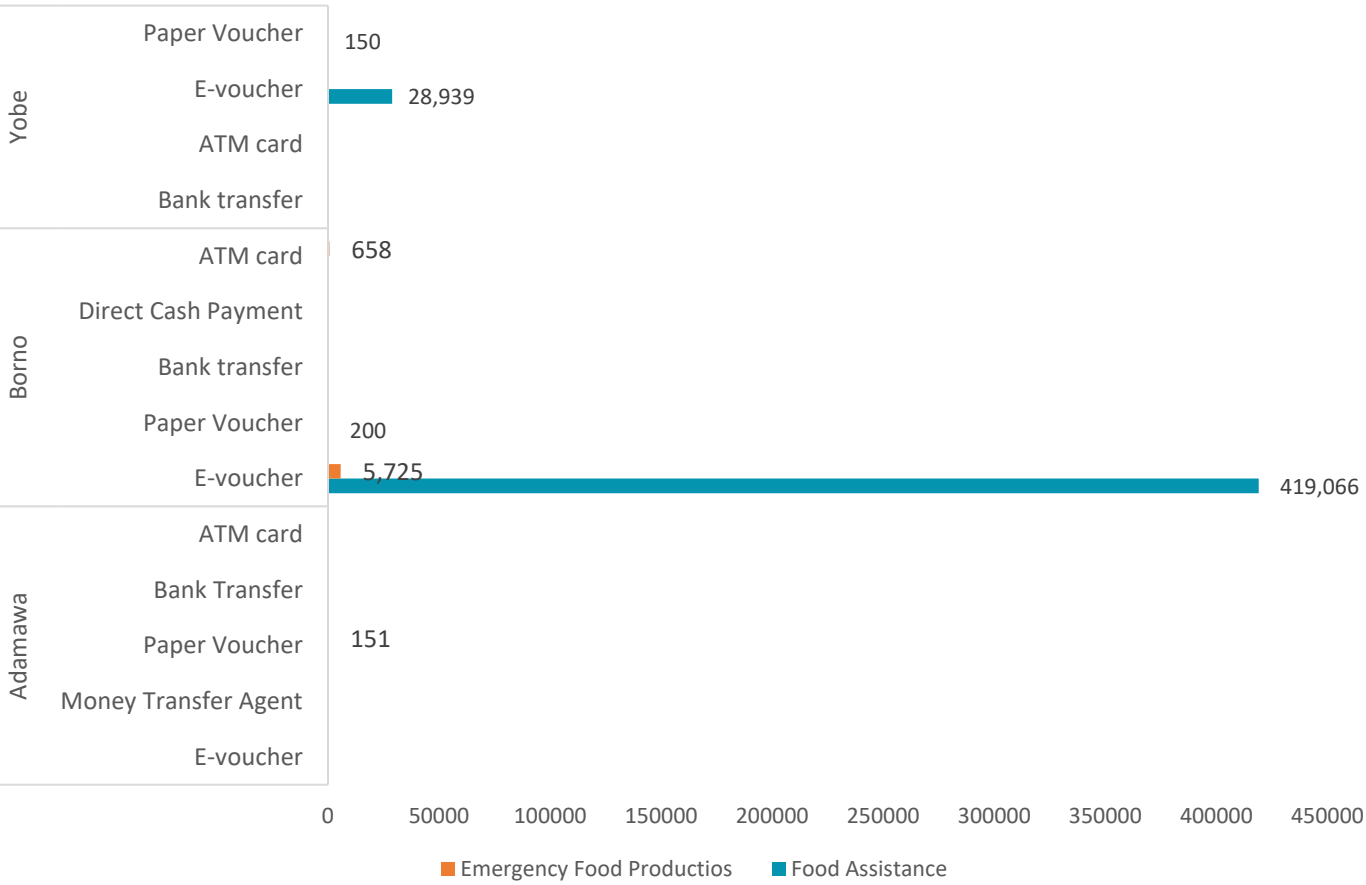
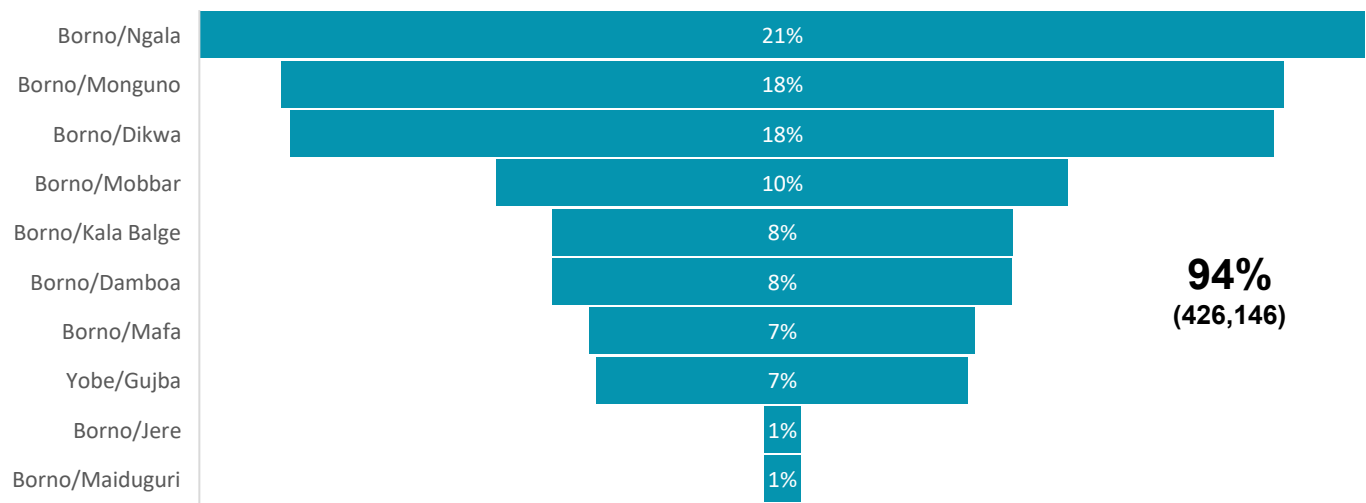


The food security sector assisted 453,297 people with food assistance and around 120,536 people with agriculture and livelihoods. 99 percent (448,355) received food assistance in cash or vouchers (CVA) and 5 percent (6,534) received emergency agriculture and on-farm livelihood support either through cash or in-kind (hybrid). A total of 12 organizations, national, and international non-governmental organizations, and UN agencies used various delivery mechanisms such as cash payments, mobile money transfers, paper vouchers, and electronic vouchers. Borno state accounts for 94 percent, Yobe of the CVA beneficiaries.

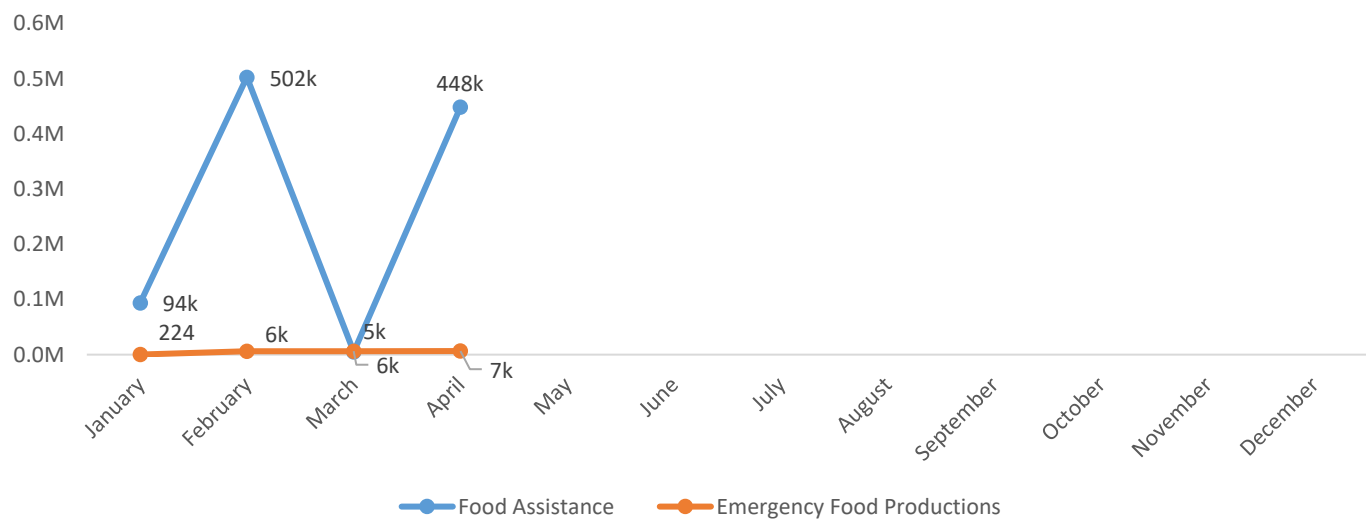
Cash Voucher Assistance (CVA) Modalities use by State



Top 5 LGAs with CVA



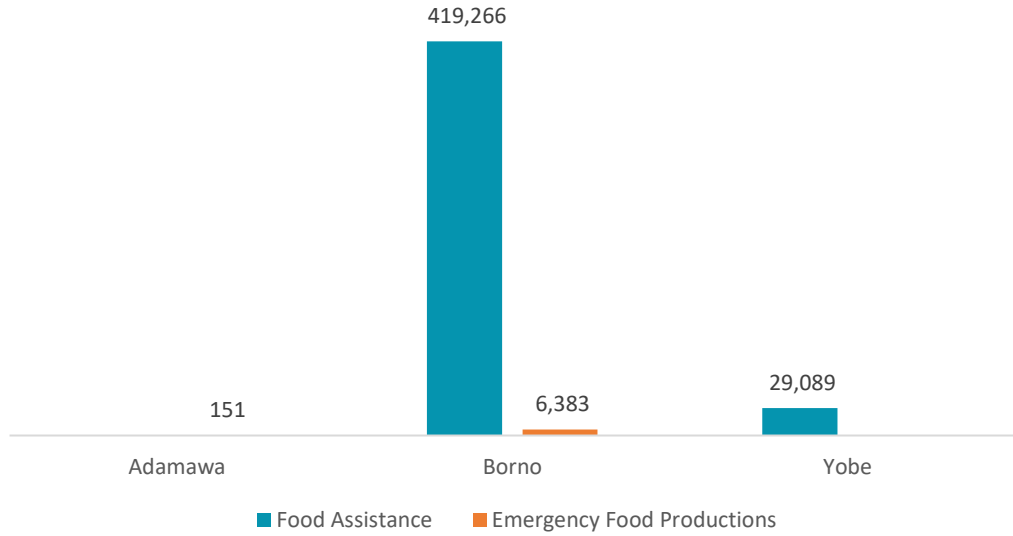
Monthly Response Monitoring (trend)



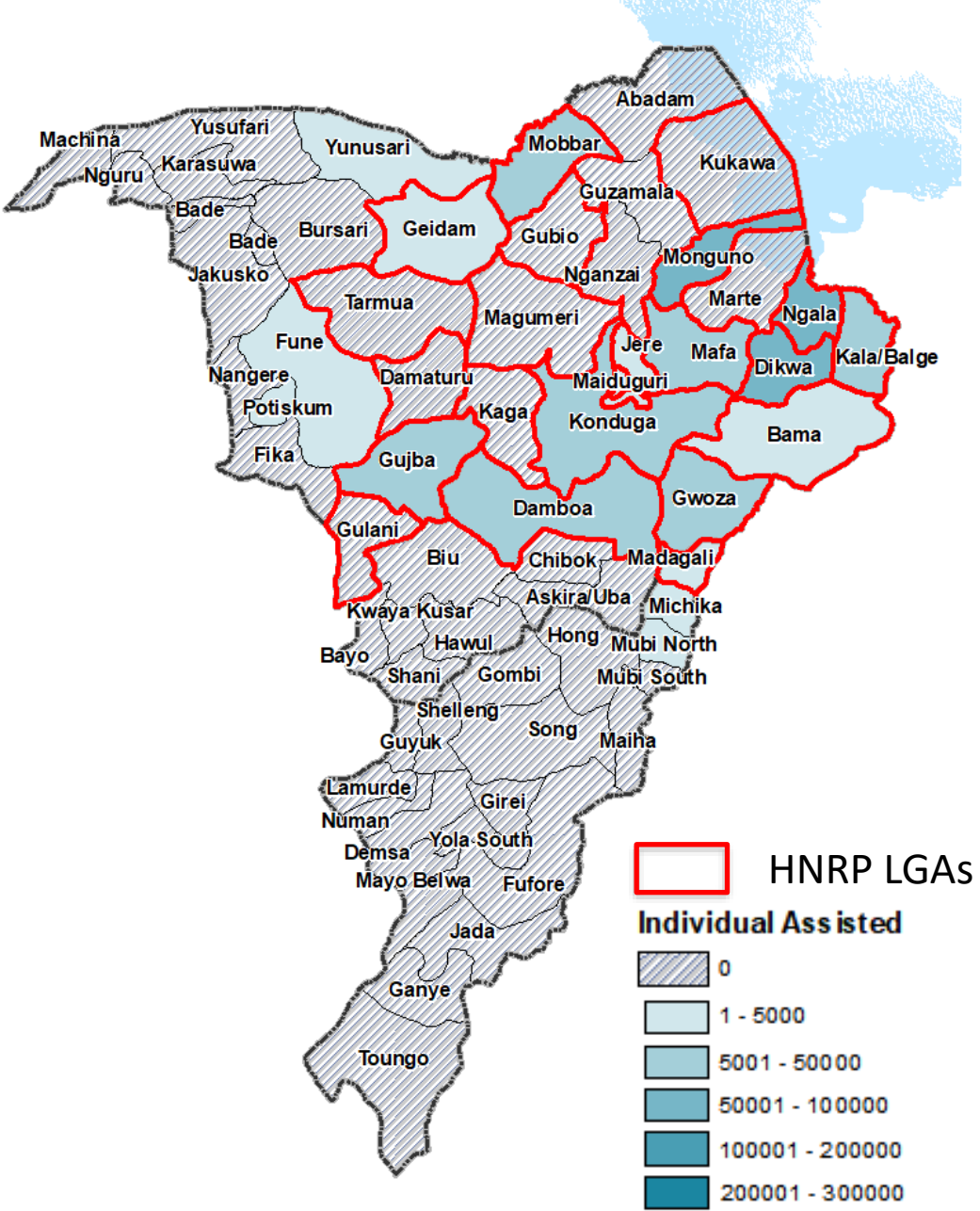
Keys figures - Cash monitoring

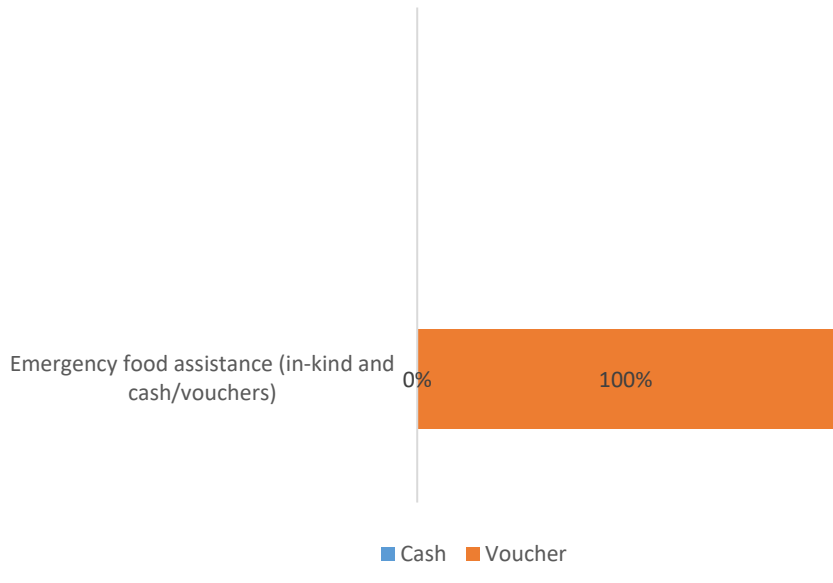

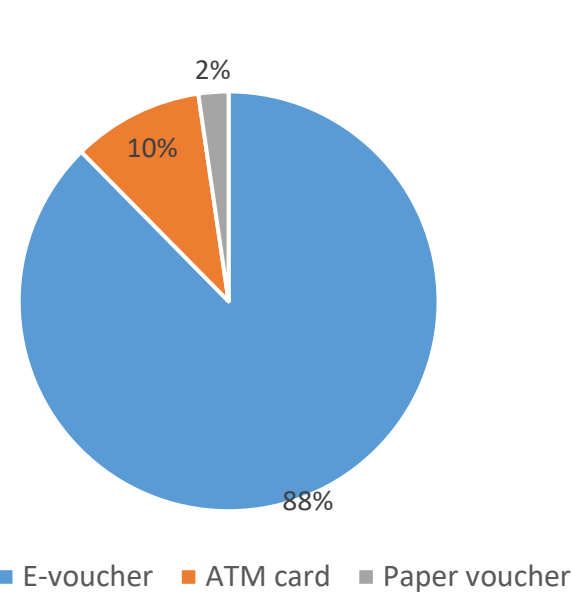

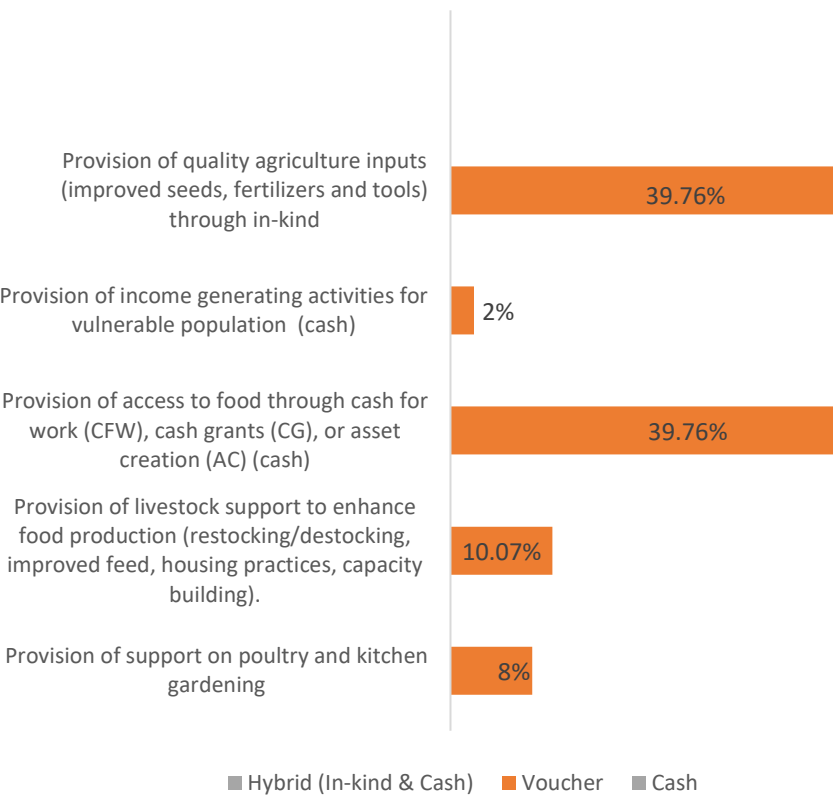
